Bathroom Cleaning Caddy Instructions

Step 1: Toilet Bowl Cleaner

- Flush Toilet to ensure toilet is working properly and there are no contaminants.
- Apply toilet bowl cleaner to the bowl of the toilet.



Hints & Tips: To help loosen "heavy build up" or "rings" in the urinals or toilet bowls, let toilet bowl cleaner set for 5-10 minutes.

Step 2: Toilet Bowl Brush

- Use toilet brush or johnny mop to scrub toilet bowl or urinal.
- Flush toilet to rinse the bowl. Use the clean water to rinse your toilet brush out.



Hints & Tips: Use brush to also clean under toilet bowl rim and anywhere you see urine or feces.

Step 3: Disinfecting Spray

- Wipe down all exterior surfaces of toilet bowl or urinal with a towel and disinfecting spray.
- Using disinfecting spray, dampen a towel and wipe flush handles and grab rails. Let air dry.



Hints & Tips: Disinfectants work best at killing bacteria with allowed time. It is recommended that a surface should stay wet with the disinfectant for at least 10 minutes before wiping off.

Step 4: Glass Cleaner

- Spray mirror with glass cleaner.
- Using a "clean cloth or towel" wipe from top to bottom to prevent streaking.



Hints & Tips: Using a lint free towel will help to achieve best results

Step 5: Descaling Cleaner

- As needed use a descaling cleaner and apply to areas of buildup. Such as Calcium, lime, rust, soap residue, etc...
- Using a fine brush, scrub the areas of buildup.
- Wipe area clean with cloth or towel.



Hints & Tips: To help loosen "heavy build up" let descaling cleaner set for at least 60 seconds before scrubbing.

Step 6: Multi Use Cleaner

- Apply multi use spray to any sinks, counter tops, dispensers, and walls.
- Wipe clean with towel or cloth.



Hints & Tips: Use multi use spray to help keep dust off ledges and the tops of bathroom stalls.

Step 7: Aerosol Disinfectant

- Using an aerosol disinfectant sanitize all areas such as door handles, fixture handles, faucets, baby changing station, or any other area that is in regular contact with hands.



Hints & Tips: Disinfecting on a regular basis will help prevent the spread of germs and bacteria.
